# I. Routine Business

- A. A Committee of the Whole meeting of the Board of Education was called to order at 6:03 p.m. at the Kenowa Hills Administration Building, 2325 Four Mile Road NW, Grand Rapids, MI.
- B. President Gustinis opened the meeting with a moment of silence.

- 1. March 2021 Check Register
  - a. Director Gilchrist answered questions from Board members about the check register.
- 2. Bond Investment Fund Update
  - a. Director Gilchrist noted that interest levels remain low due to a slow recovery from COVID-19.
- Condensed Fund Statements
  - a. March meals were at a record high. Director Williams has been providing an online meal request service for online learners and absent learners.

# B. Curriculum and Instruction

- 1. High School New Course Proposal Yoga Movement
  - a. Yoga is currently offered at KHMS. This proposal adds a yoga course for KHHS as an elective.
- 2. ESSER Funding and Programming
  - a. Assistant Superintendent Burde provided an overview of ESSER funding as it will be spent over the course of 3 years.
  - b. Dr. Burde noted that the State is providing additional funding tied to summer school offerings.
  - Dr. Burde highlighted the KHPS Michigan Integrated Continuous Improvement Process (MICIP) including additional proactive and supplementary efforts to support students.
